

#### TYPES OF MEASURES

#### Quantitative

- Tracked and reported numerically
- Metric is indicated within the measure







#### Qualitative

Tracked and reported through a list of strategies, actions or elements







#### **TIMEFRAMES**

► Short-term: 2022-2025 (design and begin construction)



► *Mid-term:* 2026–2029 (construction and ribbon-cutting)



► Long-term: 2030 or later (post construction)





#### 28 PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- ► Restorative Justice
  - » 8 measures 6 quantitative, 2 qualitative
- Community Input
  - » 8 measures 4 quantitative, 4 qualitative
- Mobility Focus

- Decisions made where community felt their input informed the project

## COMMUNITY INPUT | QUALITATIVE MEASURES



Community-informed & involved decision-making through a community-connected, transparent and inclusionary process.

- Clear communication around ongoing opportunities for providing input
- Opportunities for developing new or emerging young community leaders
- Participation in key decisions
- Educate ODOT staff, project team and the larger region about past harms and their systemic impacts

Accelerate social, racial, and economic equity sustaining positive tangible change specifically for Portland's Black community.

- Add developable land providing opportunities for the Historic Albina Community
- Increase market opportunities creating wealth for the Historic Albina Community
- Support cultural heritage, education and training opportunities
- Recruit groups not traditionally represented in decision-making who are interested in construction industry careers
- Provide immediate economic benefits to the historic Albina community
- Create enduring opportunities for wealth creation for the Historic Albina Community




